



What is RSV?

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild symptoms, like a cold, but it can cause severe illness in newborns including **bronchiolitis** and **pneumonia**.

RSV can change from mild to severe in just a few days, possibly leading to hospitalization in babies.

The good news is there is a preventative treatment available to protect your newborn from RSV.
